

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint John Wall: Feast 23rd August

John Wall was born near Preston in 1620. He was educated at Douai and the English College in Rome and ordained in 1645. In 1651 he became a Franciscan and was sent to Worcestershire in 1656 to work secretly as a priest for the next 22 years. He was arrested near Bromsgrove in December 1678 and imprisoned for five months. He was martyred by being hanged, drawn, and quartered at Red Hill. Pope Paul VI canonized him in 1970 as one of the Forty Martyrs.
